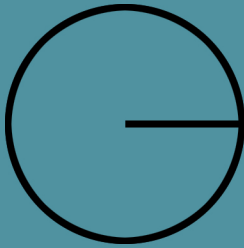

The November 3rd election offers us an opportunity to restore some balance, slow the loss of our diverse population, and preserve vital community-serving businesses. Taken together, the propositions in this year's election form the parts of an agenda for an affordable city: from dedicating funding and sites for affordable housing (Props A and K), to protecting our existing rent-controlled housing stock (Prop F) and long-term small businesses (Prop J), to holding development to high affordability standards (Prop D), and to allowing communities to determine their own future (Prop I). At the same time, some otherwise well-intentioned measures could hamper the ability of grassroots organizations to participate in the City's democratic process (No on Props C and E).

YES on Prop A: Affordable Housing Bond. We need public resources to keep San Francisco Affordable.

NO on Prop C: Lobbying Regulations. Lobbyists should be regulated, but nonprofits and unions should not be lumped with corporate fronts.

NO on Prop E: Public Meetings. Meetings should be open and accessible, but not turned over to internet spammers and corporate lobbyists.

YES on Prop F: Short Term Rentals. We need to preserve our rent-controlled homes, and keep them from being converted to hotel uses.

YES on Prop I: Pause for a Plan in the Mission. We need self-determination for our communities and neighborhoods.

YES on Prop J: Legacy Businesses. Preserves neighborhood businesses, arts groups and nonprofits that serve our communities.

YES on Prop K: Surplus Public Lands. Surplus public lands should be preserved to house San Franciscans.

These measures could have a lasting impact on our City's future.
